**All middle school classes are required to read two more books of their choice and also hand in the following summary assignment the first week back at school.

Included in your summary you must have information about the author, genre, plot, setting, and characters as well as something you found interesting in the book (maybe something you learned). Typed or on loose leaf using proper instructions on the reverse side of this paper.

All book assignments must be finished and your chosen assignment for each book is due the first week of school.

Tips for remembering what you've read:

- Keep a few large index cards in the book and summarize in 4-6 sentences what you read each day.
- Write three things you feel are important to remember about the chapter you've read.
- What questions do you have about the character or characters?
- How do the events affect each character in this chapter?
- What do you think will happen next?

Book report choices: Pick a different project for each book.

- 1. Create a **timeline** of the important events in your book using words and pictures. Use a small poster board in any color.
- 2. Pretend your book is going to be made into a movie. Create a **movie poster** to promote the movie. Use a small poster board in any color.
- 3. Make a **glossary** of at least 20 interesting words in your book. Then create a **word** search with those words. Typed out in 12 point font, Times New Roman.
- 4. Make a PowerPoint presentation about your book.
- 5. Create a **15 question test** about your book using true and false and multiple choice questions typed out in **12** point font, Times New Roman.

6. Write a series of six letters between you and a character from the book. Typed out, 12 point font, Times New Roman or your neatest cursive.
